## About the Transactions and Proceedings of the Royal Society of New Zealand

The Royal Society (known as the New Zealand Institute before 1933) was established in 1867 to co-ordinate and assist regional research societies, including the Auckland Institute, the Wellington Philosophical Society and the Otago Institute.

The *Transactions* cover a wide range of subjects. Science has always predominated but ethnography, agriculture, history and literature also featured in the early days of the publication. By the 1920s the *Transactions* were exclusively scientific, with particular focus on botany, zoology and geology.

Contributors to the *Transactions* include James Hector, William Colenso, Charles Fleming, Thomas Hocken, and Ernest Rutherford.
