The third New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings is held on Monday, 16 December.

1864

The fourth New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings is held on Thursday, 1 December.

1867

The fifth New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings is held on Thursday, 19 December.

The [Māori Representation Act 1867](#) grants Māori separate parliamentary representation.

1871

The sixth New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings is held on Monday, 27 February.

1874

The seventh New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings is held on Sunday, 1 March.

The second Māori Census is held in March.

From 1874, separate Māori censuses are conducted by the Native Department in the same years as the European censuses. The types of questions on the Māori census schedule differ from the general European schedule. Māori census collectors record details at kainga level using a common handwritten format.

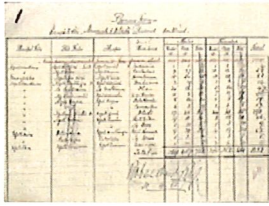


1881

The 10th New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings is held on Sunday, 28 March.

The fifth Māori Census is held in March.

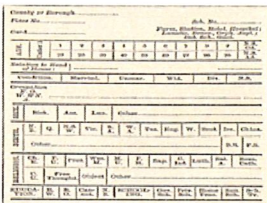
Māori census collectors begin using printed registers (books) to record details for individuals.

1891

The 11th New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings is held on Sunday, 5 April.

The sixth Māori Census is held in February.

A system of transferring information from actual census schedules onto small cards is introduced. It enables a number of new and different tables to be made.
