Covid-19 may have been dormant in a Ruby Princess cruise ship passenger for 10 weeks.

The woman, who tested positive for the virus in Cairns in the Australian state of Queensland, was a passenger on the cruise ship that visited New Zealand in March.

Queensland Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk told reporters on Tuesday they were trying to work out if the new case was "directly related to the Ruby Princess or if it was acquired in some other way".

A previous test performed on the woman returned a negative result, and a spokesperson for the health minister told *AAP* it wasn't possible she was contagious after disembarking the ship on March 19.



The Ruby Princess cluster has been linked to hundreds of infections and over 20 deaths.

The ship visited New Zealand between March 11 and March 15. It shortened its itinerary and returned to Sydney early.


