France Restores a Looted Monet to Owner's Heirs (details)

Following the end of the Second World War, the painting was returned to France, however the ownership of the painting was not immediately known. In 1998, Elaine Rosenberg (Paul Rosenberg's daughter-in-law) sent a photograph of the missing painting to a "London-based registry that operates a database of stolen art" and matched the image to a painting in the collection of a museum in Caen, France. The painting was found while it was on loan to the Boston Museum of Fine Arts. In 1999, Catherine Trautmann, France's minister of culture, presented the painting to Rosenberg's heirs: Elaine Rosenberg and his grand-daughter Elizabeth Clark.
