THE RESIDENT MAGISTRATE'S COURT ACT, 1867.

"An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Resident Magistrates, and to the Jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace in Civil matters. [10th October, 1867.]

Clause 2 repeals, besides other Acts, an Ordinancs to provide for the establishment of Resident Magistrate's Courts, passed by the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council, (Session 7, No. 18.)

"Resident Magistrate Court Ordinance Amendment Act, 1856, No. 20;" "The Resident Magistrate's Court Act, 1858;" and Section 31 of "The Native Circuit Courts Act, 1858."

Clause 39 provides that all summonses, warrants, &c., addressed to Natives, shall be accompanied by a Maori translation.
