This year marks the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II,

New Zealand's head of State. She will be celebrating 70 years of sovereignty on Sunday 5 June, alongside the

Commonwealth nations. New Zealand is a constitutional monarchy, so the Sovereign is our head of state. She is the source of all executive legal authority in New Zealand, and acts on the advice of the Government in all but the most exceptional circumstances. The Sovereign is represented in New Zealand by the Governor-General. There have been 16 people in this role since the start of Queen Elizabeth's reign.

• 23 Dec 1953 - 31 Jan 1954: Following her coronation in June 1953, the Queen visited New Zealand for over a month, during she opened a special session of Parliament, laid the foundation stone of the Anglican Cathedral, and visited numerous d cities.

uary 1963: During this tour the Queen attended celebrations at Waitangi and the Queen Elizabeth II Arts Council ablished as New Zealand's gift to the Queen.
