Let anti-transgender activist in, National says, while Greens hold concerns for public safety

P Political parties have differing views on a controversial UK anti-transgender activist (<https://www.rnz.co.nz/news/national/485828/another-conspiracy-group-british-anti-trans-rights-activist-plans-stop-in-aotearoa>) being allowed to enter the country as Immigration New Zealand continues to review her case (<https://www.rnz.co.nz/news/national/486347/immigration-new-zealand-reviewing-entry-of-anti-transgender-activist>).

P Kellie-Jay Keen-Minshull, also known as Posie Parker, has planned to hold rallies at Albert Park in Auckland and Civic Square in Wellington this weekend.

Supporters of Keen-Minshull were seen performing Nazi salutes and abusing LGBTQIA counter-protesters at her event in Melbourne on Sunday.

P But Terri Lipanovic, of the local Posie Parker organising committee, said Keen-Minshull was not anti-trans, she was simply "pro women's and children's safety".

Any neo-Nazis turning up at rallies in Auckland and Wellington this weekend will be told to leave, she said.
