The new government was finally announced today - bringing an end to 40-odd days of coalition negotiations between National, ACT and New Zealand First.

The new cabinet will be made up of 20 MPs, 14 from National, three from ACT and three from New Zealand First.

There are eight ministers outside parliament - five from National, two from ACT and one from NZ First.

NZ First and ACT will also each have a parliamentary under-secretary.

National's Gerry Brownlee will be nominated as Speaker of the House.
