Module 10 opened on Tuesday 17 September 2024 and is the final module of the Covid-19 UK Inquiry. This module will examine the impact of Covid on the

population of the United Kingdom with a particular focus on key workers, the most vulnerable, the bereaved, mental health and wellbeing.

The module will also seek to identify where societal strengths, resilience and or innovation reduced any adverse impact.

The application process to become a Core Participant for Module 10 has now closed.

The Inquiry plans to hear evidence for this investigation in London over three weeks from 16 February 2026 – 5 March 2026
